

Shute Harbour Restoration

Project Update April 2018

The Shute Harbour marine facility was badly damaged during Severe Tropical Cyclone Debbie in March 2017. Restoration works to terminal buildings, jetties and pontoons will be undertaken by Whitsunday Regional Council, with joint funding from the Commonwealth and Queensland Governments under the Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements (NDRRA).

Demolition Works Begin

Demolition works began Monday 9 April 2018 to remove the damaged terminal buildings and jetties. These works are expected to be completed by mid June 2018, weather permitting.

There will be less parking available in the lower carpark, as sections of the carpark will be fenced off during the works. However the upper carpark will remain open for any parking overflow.

There will also be changes to the traffic flow movement throughout the site during the demolition works. Signage will be in place at all times, so please drive carefully and follow all safety instructions onsite.



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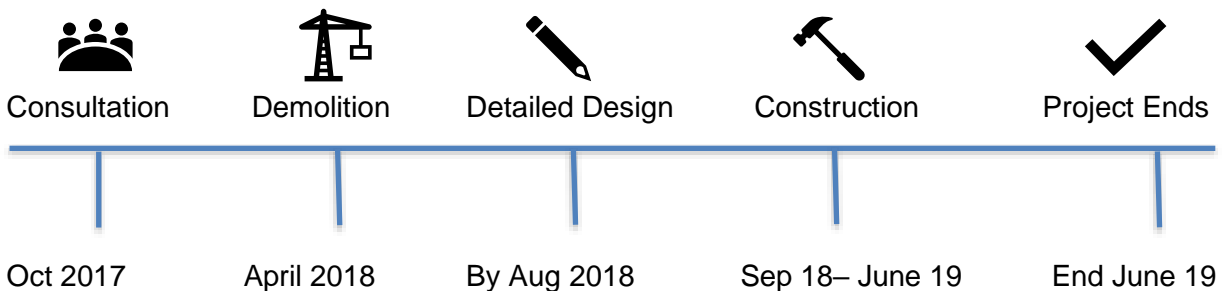
Detailed Design will start soon

Council will soon be undertaking a detailed design process for the restoration of the Shute Harbour marine facility. The detailed design will be delivered by external specialist consultants.

A detailed design for Stage 1 (restoration of the facility after cyclone damage) will be released to the public after mid-2018.

It is expected the construction works for Stage 1 will begin shortly afterwards, and will be completed by mid-2019.
